Steve Hudson is the Assistant Chief, responsible for Patrol Operations, of the Prince William County, Virginia, Police Department. He began his law enforcement career as an evidence technician for the FBI in 1980 and joined the PWC Police Department two years later. As he rose through the ranks, he worked in patrol, investigations, as an academy instructor, in the juvenile bureau, vice and narcotics, internal affairs, special operations and SWAT—in several posts as the unit commander.
