

## **Anne C. Tremblay**

Anne C. Tremblay is an Assistant City Attorney for the City of Los Angeles and is currently assigned to Mayor Garcetti's Office as the Interim Director of the Gang Reduction & Youth Development (GRYD) program. Previously, Ms. Tremblay supervised the City Attorney's Anti-Gang Section where she led the office's efforts in gang, firearms and graffiti prosecution. In addition, she was part of a team that created and administered the gang alternative sentencing program and the gang injunction removal process.

Ms. Tremblay joined the City in 2002 and spent over five years as the Neighborhood Prosecutor assigned to Los Angeles Police Department's Newton Area. In this position, she worked in partnership with the police, city agencies and area stakeholders on projects designed to improve the quality of life and increase safety in the community. Prior to working for the City, Ms. Tremblay spent six years as a Deputy District Attorney for the County of Orange.

In 2004, Ms. Tremblay was recognized by the Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) with their Metlife Community Partnership Award for her collaboration with community based organizations and community developers on the Central Avenue Community Safety Initiative. Ms. Tremblay was honored by the Peace Officers Association of Los Angeles County with their Centurion Award for Outstanding Achievement in the Area of Innovations in 2005 and was awarded the Los Angeles Police Commission's Distinguished Service Medal in 2007 for her work on projects in South Los Angeles. Ms. Tremblay is the author of *Beyond Community Policing: Engaging Prosecutors in Community Safety Partnerships* – a publication of the LISC Community Safety Paper Series.

Ms. Tremblay holds a J.D. from Emory University School of Law and a B.A. in History from the University of California Berkeley. She is the 2013-14 President of the Women Lawyers Association of Los Angeles.
